Buck Wehrbein, National Cattlemen's Beef Association: "National Industry Issues Update"

National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) President Buck Wehrbein was born and raised on a small farm in eastern Nebraska, where his family raised cattle, hogs and chickens. Wehrbein has dedicated his career to cattle



feeding, managing custom feedlots in Nebraska and Texas since 1984 and feeding his own cattle since 1980. An active industry servant, Wehrbein served as the Nebraska Beef Council chairman and on the Beef Promotion and Operating Committee before being tapped for NCBA's top post. He will share highlights from the organization's Policy and Federation Divisions, including updates on key tax, transportation and animal health wins: the New World screwworm; the Endangered Species Act; trade: and more.

Resolutions will be voted on in committees Thursday and then in the closing general session on Friday.



Kevin Good, CattleFax: "Cattle and Beef Industry Update and Outlook"

Kevin Good, vice president of market analysis and industry relations, has been with CattleFax since 1982, working with producers and agribusinesses to help them understand the changes taking place in the commodities industries, with an emphasis in



animal proteins. Good will cover where the cattle industry is within the cattle cycle and analyze interactions between supply, demand, leverage and prices for cattle and beef, as well as the impact of weather, grain and hay markets, tariffs, trade and the economy.

Joe Scheele, U.S. Customs and Border Protection: "Safeguarding Agriculture at the Border"

Joe Scheele, the California agriculture liaison for U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and his colleagues are on the frontlines protecting American agriculture at the border every day. In Scheele's role, he collaborates with numerous federal, state and local stakeholders on ag safeguarding Joe Scheele



initiatives to protect the industry from invasive pests and foreign animal diseases. He will give convention-goers a look into the agency's work and talk about some of its current endeavors, including the pushback of the New World screwworm.

Tucker Brown, Beef Advocate of the Year: "Building Your Future by Thinking Inside the Box" Tucker Brown is a sixthgeneration rancher at the R.A. Brown Ranch in Throckmorton, Texas. Brown quickly realized that, in today's world, being a good rancher isn't just about raising great cattle and horses,



but telling your story. Through social media, he's been able to share the truth about American ranching in a way that is both educational and entertaining. He has earned more than a half million followers online, earning him the National Cattlemen's Beef Association's Beef Advocate of the Year Award and even a feature in Vanity Fair. Brown will share how ranchers can use social media to grow their businesses, tell their stories and create opportunities for future generations. Brown will highlight practical ways to build trust with consumers, advocate for the beef industry and stay competitive in a fast-changing world. This

session will inspire attendees to embrace digital tools, share their values and turn tradition into traction online.
